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#### INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT

Board of Education Cayuga-Onondaga BOCES Auburn, New York

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of the Extraclassroom Activity Funds of Cayuga-Onondaga BOCES (BOCES) as of and for the year ended June 30, 2020, which comprise the Statement of Assets and Fund Balance - Cash Basis, the related Statement of Cash Receipts, Cash Disbursements, and Changes in Fund Balance for the year then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

#### **Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements**

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with the cash basis of accounting described in Note 1; this includes determining that the cash basis of accounting is an acceptable basis for the preparation of the financial statements in the circumstances. Management is also responsible for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

#### **Auditors' Responsibility**

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit. We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditors' judgment, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to BOCES' preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of BOCES' internal control. Accordingly, we express no such opinion. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial statements.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion.

### **Opinion**

In our opinion, the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the assets and fund balance of the Extraclassroom Activity Funds of BOCES, as of June 30, 2020, and the cash receipts, cash disbursements, and changes in fund balance thereof, for the year then ended in accordance with the cash basis of accounting as described in Note 1.

### **Basis of Accounting**

We draw attention to Note 1 of the financial statements, which describes the basis of accounting. The financial statements are prepared on the cash basis of accounting, which is a basis of accounting other than accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. Our opinion is not modified with respect to this matter.

### EXTRACLASSROOM ACTIVITY FUNDS NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS JUNE 30, 2020

#### **Note 1** Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

The Student Extraclassroom Activity Funds of Cayuga-Onondaga BOCES (BOCES) represent funds of the students of BOCES. The Board of Education exercises general oversight of these funds. Therefore, these funds are included in the Agency Fund of BOCES' basic financial statements. The Extraclassroom Activity Funds are independent of BOCES with respect to its financial transactions and designation of student management.

Student Extraclassroom Activity Funds included in this report were formed only for educational and school service purposes in accordance with BOCES' rules and regulations for the conduct, operation, and maintenance of Extraclassroom activities.

The accounts of the Extraclassroom Activity Funds of BOCES are maintained on a cash basis of accounting, and the Statement of Cash Receipts, Cash Disbursements, and Changes in Fund Balance reflects only cash received and disbursed. Therefore, receivables and payables, inventories, long-lived assets, and accrued income and expenses, which would be recognized under generally accepted accounting principles, and which may be material in amount, are not recognized in the accompanying financial statements.

#### Note 2 Cash and Cash Equivalents - Custodial and Concentration of Credit Risk

The Student Extraclassroom Activity Funds cash and cash equivalents consist of cash on hand and demand deposits. New York State law governs BOCES' investment policies. Resources must be deposited in Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC) insured commercial banks or trust companies located within the state. Permissible investments include obligations of the United States Treasury, United States Agencies, repurchase agreements and obligations of New York State or its localities. Collateral is required for demand and time deposits and certificates of deposit not covered by FDIC insurance. Obligations that may be pledged as collateral are obligations of the United States and its agencies and obligations of the state and its municipalities and districts. Investments, if any, are stated at fair value. There were no investments at June 30, 2020.

Custodial credit risk is the risk that in the event of a bank failure, the Student Extraclassroom Activity Fund's deposits may not be returned to it. While the Student Extraclassroom Activity Fund does not have a specific policy for custodial credit risk, New York State statutes govern BOCES' investment policies, as discussed previously in these notes. Governmental Accounting Standards Board (GASB) Statement No. 40 directs that deposits be disclosed as exposed to custodial credit risk if they are not covered by depository insurance, and the deposits are either uncollateralized or collateralized with securities held by the pledging financial institution's trust department or agent, but not in BOCES' name.

The Student Extraclassroom Activity Fund's aggregate bank balances of \$14,366 are either insured or collateralized with securities held by the pledging financial institution in BOCES' name.
